Extra information

In September 2013 I took one paper of Level 4 and four papers of Level 3 Audit Halal Meat Processing in New Zealand and passed all with distinction (“A” result).

All the details can be viewed with New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) with National Student Number (NSN): 146308823. From October 2013 to May 2015 I assisted the New Zealand Islamic Development Trust (NZIDT) to audit more than 60 processing sites for these products from Fonterra, Silver Fern Farms, Alliance Group Ltd., AFFCO, South Pacific Meats Ltd., Lean Meats, Ovation NZ Ltd, Riverlands, CMP, Progressive Meats Ltd., Taylor Preston, Graeme Lowe Corp., and Bakels Edible Oils (NZ). All these big companies produce million dollars of revenue to New Zealand. NZIDT provides Halal export certificates for companies that want to sell products to Singapore, UAE, and Malaysia. The production of Halal Notice 2010 by NZIDT helped New Zealand won the award for best service provider at the World Halal Forum in Malaysia in April 2011 – being the first time a non-Muslim country has won the award. Fonterra, for instance, with NZIDT, has come out also with its Halal standards [PA named standards for Fonterra Halal mechanism – e.g. Halal Assurance systems (PPMC37 and FFS28) and Halal Assurance Rule (FOR04), and HAS Internal Audit Checklist Manufacturing Sites]. Auditing with NZIDT has helped me to gain experience and further market the standards for world Halal industry. Accordingly, halal accounting is also in my area of expertise.
